WHAT IS ITCH NETWORK?

ITCH stands for Information Technology Can Help. We are a network of volunteers, founded in 1994, who provide FREE computer support to disabled people.

We visit people in their own homes and at other locations such as day centres. ITCH Network has helped more than a 1,000 disabled people over the past two years.

WHO'S BEHIND THE SCHEME?

ITCH Network is a project of The British Computer Society Disability Group (BCS-DG). The BCS-DG is a special interest group that focuses on how computer technology can help disabled people, and has been working within the voluntary disability sector for over 20 years.

ITCH Network now covers more than 40 counties in the U.K. and is increasing its coverage all the time. The goal is to have full UK coverage by 2003.

HOW CAN ITCH NETWORK HELP?

We can help you in the following ways:

- ☐ Provide impartial advice on computer hardware and software
- ☐ Install new equipment and software
- ☐ Help you get connected to the internet and use e-mail
